I started working on an autonomous wheelchair as a sophomore. It's a challenging project. From something like the slightest wiggle of a finger, we're trying to perform very complex tasks—moving the chair from one room to another with the desired speed and control.

It's a really big goal, and I love it. This is my chance to leave my mark and have an impact.
